A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Choices. That's what ChooseWell Communities provides: choices that have been removed from families due to the disease of addiction - a disease that does not care about anything but taking over and destroying. How do I know? My family is plagued with addiction and trauma, too.

As Executive Director of this life-changing organization, I get to witness the bravery of our parents on a daily basis.

Raising children in current times is hard enough without the added challenge of maintaining sobriety. But thanks to the efforts of our participants, *their children are getting the best version of their parents* - something many others do not.

Kentucky leads the nation in child abuse, child maltreatment, and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), and our families are no different. Each of our clients scores at least a 6 out of 10 on the ACEs scale. Science tells us anyone with a score over a 4 is likely to become an addict.

By providing an environment that is conducive to nurturing and learning, with a heavy emphasis on self-care, ChooseWell Communities' participants enjoy classes on budgeting, parenting, behavior modeling, and recovery, thereby building their Recovery Capital in order to build resilience and find success long-term. We help families reunite from state removal, serve as ombudsman in health care situations, and provide the "I've got your back" that every person needs, whether they're suffering from the disease of addiction or not.

I appreciate each person reading this letter. I appreciate our Board Members, sponsors, and donors who continue to serve and give, believe in us, and provide space for ChooseWell Communities to operate as a model for continued success. I appreciate our community partners and referral sources with whom we continue to build strong bonds, tackling the complicated health care systems in which people sometimes get lost.

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But mostly, I appreciate the ChooseWell Communities families.

To watch our participants grow in recovery and bond with their children (in some cases reunifying with children who were removed from the household) is so rewarding. I cannot imagine myself anywhere else.

I look forward to building a stronger, larger, more sustainable ChooseWell Communities, addressing the ever-growing needs of recovery assistance, ACEs reduction, and family bonding in Louisville and surrounding counties. People do recover and become valuable members of society. *Thank you for believing in us.*

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRWOMAN

Dear ChooseWell Friends and Supporters:

Despite 2021's well-documented challenges, ChooseWell Communities (CWC) has continued to thrive. This is a result of the work of our dedicated staff, our Board of Directors, friends and supporters of CWC, and, most importantly, the families we serve.

ChooseWell Communities' approach is unique. We are the only organization in Louisville providing long-term, permanent housing suitable for families with young children, coupled with recovery-focused coaching and support for more than three years. By keeping families together, CWC addresses a leading cause of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) with an effective, upstream response to the growing number of Kentucky children whose lives are altered by a parent's addiction.



Our impact is substantial. From 2014 to through 2021, ChooseWell Communities has served 95 families, 100% living in poverty. In less than a year following graduation, 3 participants were able to purchase their first homes. Together, our participants have achieved more than 100 combined years of sobriety. Moreover, ChooseWell Communities breaks the cycle of trauma: all of our parents have experienced six or more ACEs—childhood experiences of abuse, neglect, and household dysfunction that significantly increase the risk of poor health and social outcomes in adulthood. CWC Parents learn strategies and participate in experiences that result in reunification with their children in safe, healthy, and drug-free homes and dramatically improved odds of long-term sobriety.

Despite challenges surrounding COVID-19 and its continued effects on our community, our 2021 highlights included:

- Ensuring that client's families' needs were met and providing a blend of virtual and on-site programming
- Proudly recognizing our second graduating class of eight parents with an average of 3.5 years of sobriety each
- Developing deeper relationships with community partners
- Expanding the CWC Board of Directors and its diversity to mirror the racial diversity in the Louisville community
- Welcoming a new Executive Director, Leigh Ann Yost
- Hosting our 4th annual Walk Through the Wild at the Louisville Zoo, the largest fundraiser in CWC history

Everyone associated with ChooseWell Communities is proud to continue to build upon their original visions. On behalf of the Board, Staff, and Member Families, *we are looking forward to an outstanding 2022*, and we hope you will continue with us on our journey! Thank you.



the most common reason people use substances is to self-medicate from past trauma or abuse, often stemming from their own childhood







children with parents who abuse alcohol or drugs are 6 times more likely to experience abuse or neglect than children in other households
